HOUSING VOUCHERS TIED TO UNITS, NOT INDIVIDUALS



Residents signed a service agreement and treatment plan with a county HIV caseworker

PROJECT-BASED MODEL



Compliance was a condition of residency



Ensured engagement with necessary services and support systems

SHIFT TO HOUSING FIRST MODEL

Transitioned from a project-based approach about 4 years ago

Housing First model emphasizes housing as a fundamental right

No loss of housing due to non-compliance with service or treatment plans

IMPLEMENTATION CHALLENGES

Adapting to Housing First model with 25 units under one roof

Required reevaluation of the Center's approach

Successfully navigated the transition with the addition of a Director of Client and Housing Services
